## Today's Music

Michael J. Glasgow, Minister of Music

Today is an exciting day in the life of the music ministry! This afternoon, rehearsals begin for our various singing and ringing ensembles for children and youth. If you haven't registered your kids and would like for them to be included, *please* take a moment to complete the registration right after worship so that we are ready! It may be found at [nrumc.org/kids-youth-ministries](http://nrumc.org/kids-youth-ministries) (many thanks to all of you who have already registered; it's a huge help!).

This morning's worship is enhanced by the music of J.S. Bach. Candace Bailey has prepared the two sections of his *Toccatà and Fugue in D Minor* for our prelude and postlude, and a *Siciliano* for the offertory.

Now, Bach wrote some 15 toccatas and dozens of fugues. Two of his "toccata and fugue pairings" are in D minor. This morning's are from BWV 538. ("BWV" is the *Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis*, a cataloging system of J.S. Bach's compositions; it was originally published in 1950.) The much-better-known BWV 565 is the D-minor toccata and fugue associated with spooky movies such as *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* and *The Phantom of the Opera*. BWV 538 is nicknamed "Dorian" due to its association with the Dorian liturgical mode (this mode, which people interested in music theory will find intriguing, is akin to a diatonic/pure minor scale with a raised sixth degree).

Our anthem is an American folk tune which has been subjected to many variations of its own over the years. Its lyrics have interchanged "valley" and "river," and also swapped "in" and "to." The piece soared to pop-culture familiarity in 2000 when it was featured accompanying the baptism scene in the film *O Brother, Where Art Thou?*

Jay Althouse's anthem pays homage to the simplicity of the tune and its dubious-but-undoubtedly-humble origins. This arrangement also incorporates an unaccompanied stanza of another American folk tune, the hymn LONESOME VALLEY. We thank Laurie Davis for singing the plaintive solo which bookends this piece!
